MISSION STATEMENT

The American School is a student-centered, college preparatory institution that fosters globally-responsible citizens and leaders by offering a rigorous, international education which promotes core values in a safe, innovative, and collaborative environment.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

The American School of Tegucigalpa is celebrating 70 years of excellence serving students from 15 nations. English is the language of primary instruction. Students complete a Honduran Bachillerato, the High School Diploma and the International Baccalaureate; IB Diploma and Certificates are optional. Spanish as a second language is offered to international students. AST's facilities consist of 90 classrooms, including 4 Science and 4 computer laboratories with 30 terminals each, 800 chromebooks, 200 iPads and wireless internet access throughout campus. A separate computer technology center is available for teachers. Jefferson Valle Media Center provides facilities that serve Pre-School and Elementary as well as Middle and High School students. The center has 47 computers, 12 chromebooks, 9 laptops, and 6 kindles. Students can access 24/7 Destiny-school's online catalog and safe search tool. To support research the school subscribes to ABC-Clio, Noodle Tools, and EBSCOhost; also available to students online. The collection houses more than 52,000 printed volumes, 880 eBooks, and a curriculum-tied AV collection. The media center also subscribes to 13 printed magazines, some of them with online access.

CALENDAR

The school year consists of 182 days divided into 2 semesters. The first semester begins in August and second semester in January. Grades are issued quarterly. The school day begins at 7:30 am and ends at 2:30 pm.

ENROLLMENT

Total enrollment at AST for the 2016-2017 school year is 1116 students. The high school enrollment is 299 of which 79 are seniors. Approximately 5% of the students are US citizens, 94% are Honduran and 1% of other nationalities.

EACHITY

There are 125 full time faculty members including 13 administrators. 46% are international and 54% Honduran. 93% are fully bilingual and 61% hold at least one masters Degree.

ACCREDITATION

AST is accredited by Advanced ED and the International Baccalaureate Program. The Honduran Ministry of Education grants the national degree of Bachillerato to students who comply with additional credits and 160 hours of community service.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The activities sponsored by staff after school include Operation Smile, Art Club, Bible Study, Knowledge Bowl, Student Council, Math Olympics, Environmental Club, Honduras Project, Cheerleading, Cross Country, Science Club, Band, Extiende tu Mano, Jóvenes en Acción, Casitas Kennedy, Bencaleth Orphanage. Our students also collaborate in fund-raising activities for children with cerebral palsy, homeless and senior citizens. Students attend leadership conferences such as HACIA Democracy, Model United Nations and Junior State of America.

SPORTS

The AST offers the opportunity for athletic competition in three varsity sports: cross country, basketball, soccer and volleyball. AST teams compete nationally and internationally against schools affiliated with the Association of Bilingual Schools of Honduras (ABSH) and the Association of American Schools of Central America (AASCA). During the academic year 2015-2016, AST won 6 national tournaments 3 in basketball and 3 in soccer; also 2 Central American championships, 1 soccer and 1 in Basketball.
